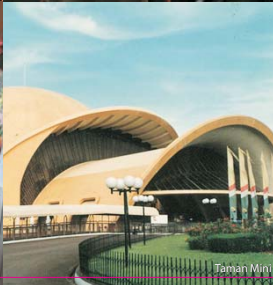

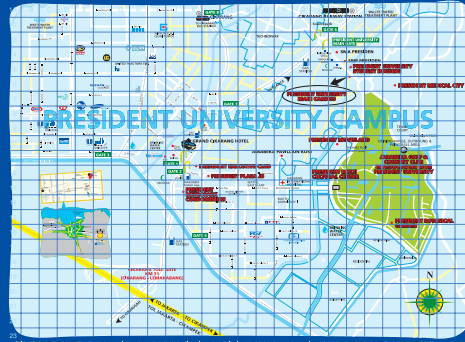

## Indonesian Language & Cultural Studies Program



The Indonesian Language and Culture Program is a one year, three semester program, designed to help students who wish to study, or do research on the various cultures of Indonesia, and at the same time learn, not just the language, but some commonly used words from some of the many Indonesian dialects.

At the end of their studies, students who pass the final tests will be awarded a "Diploma of Indonesian Language and Cultural Studies" from President University.

### DETAILS OF THE PROGRAM

#### BAHASA INDONESIA

To teach the students Bahasa Indonesia from basic skills to intermediate and advanced levels. For this we will maximize the role of our own Indonesian lecturers.

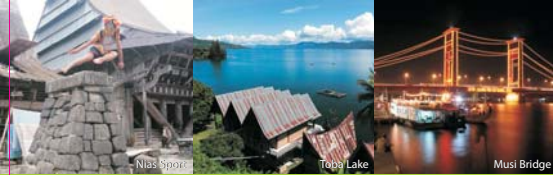

## HISTORY AND POLITICS

 SEMESTER III The era of reform (1998-2010).
